Welcome All Competitors to the 47th Annual Kaslo, B.C. Logger Sports Show

As we are all well aware the Kaslo Logger Sports Competition has not been held for the past two years (since 2019), so we welcome All Competitors back to our humble event, as part of the 2022 Kaslo May Days Celebration. It has been a tough go for everyone over the last few years and we look forward to the revival of the Kaslo Logger Sports Competition this year.

Once again, our two-day format has **Novice, Intermediate and Local events on Saturday, May 21st** and **Open and Women's on Sunday, May 22nd**.

We have six Canadian Championships:

1. Open Unlimited Hot Saw,
2. Novice Tree Climb
3. Novice Double Buck
4. Intermediate Underhand Chop
5. Intermediate 100cc Hot Saw
6. Women's Choker Race.

*Competitor meetings for both days will be at 8:30 a.m with a few eliminations prior to the start of the main competition at 11:00 a.m.

All Local events must have a minimum 3 entries to run events. If the minimum is not met, the event will be canceled.

A Canlog membership is mandatory (locals exempt) and can be purchased on the day or **preferably** prior to our show. Canlog rules will be enforced by "The Judge" so make sure you read the updated rules at Canlog.ca.

Most equipment in novice and intermediate events may be used by not more than two competitors in the same event.

Please indicate on your entry form if you plan to lend or borrow.

Cash prizes will be awarded as follows:

As per Canlog rules 5 points will be awarded for first, 3 for second, 2 for third and 1 for fourth.

All sawing wood will be West Kootenay white pine (Pinus Kootenensis). All hand sawing events will have a starting cut. As usual, chopping wood will be popular poplar.

The tree falling will be a 14 person draw. Bush saws only. You are required to supply your own chainsaw, head, face, ear and leg protection. For further information see the Tree Falling rules which are attached.

Kaslo Logger Sports Tree Falling Rules

- There will be fourteen falling trees in total.
- Competitors who enter the tree falling will draw for the available trees. The number they draw will be their tree number. Some competitors may not get a tree if there are more competitors than there are trees. Late entries will not be accepted in this event if there are fourteen competitors entered by the 13th.
- There will be three heats of four and one heat of two competitors.
- Competitors must supply their own saws, leg, ear, face and head protection. All personal protective equipment must be CSA or ANSI approved and in good condition.
- Competitors must wear and use their PPE properly while falling. Example: failure to not lower your face screen and or leave your earmuffs “up” will result in disqualification.
- Saws must be “bush” saws (no racing saws) with working chain breaks, chain catchers, and throttle interlocks.
- The competitor will start by standing at the base of his or her tree and on the word go will start their saw (chain breaks must be on when starting the saw) and fall their tree. Time will stop when the tree hits the ground.
- Undercuts must be relatively “clean” (can use either conventional or humbolt), and at least three inches deep.
- Back-cuts must not be lower than the undercut union at any point.
- Back-barring (using a pushing chain) will not be allowed.
- There must be a complete hinge for the holding wood (no cut off holding wood).
- The object is to hit a peg at a given distance (30 ft) in front of the tree. The competitor who hits the peg with the tree on its initial fall in the quickest time will be the winner. The remaining place getters will be the ones who score the lowest cumulative points of time in seconds plus distance in inches. Trees will be measured for distance from the outer diameter of the tree and the nearest point to the peg. Trees will be measured from where they end up (stop bouncing, rolling), not from where they hit the ground. Trees that do not hit the peg on the way down but roll or bounce onto or into the peg will receive a 1 for distance.
- There will be a 60 second time limit for the falling of the tree.
- The decision(s) of the judge will be final.
